Clinical Trial - A **clinical trial** is any research study that prospectively assigns human participants or groups of humans to health-related interventions to evaluate the effects on health outcomes. Interventions may be invasive or non-invasive; examples include: drugs, cells and other biological products, surgical procedures, radiologic procedures, devices, behavioral treatments, process-of-care changes, or preventive care.

All trials must be registered in a [publicly accessible](#) registry prior to submission, and a registry number must be provided. We strongly encourage reading our [author guidelines](#) to ensure that all appropriate reporting protocols are followed and that all required documents are included with your submission.

Research Article - Research articles must report on [original research that contributes to the base of academic knowledge](#). Reviews, essays, opinion pieces, hypothesis papers, and other items of secondary literature are not considered.

Collection Review & Overview - Collection Reviews and Overviews will only be reviewed when submitted as part of an authorized *PLOS ONE* collection. Please do not select any of these options unless you have been instructed to do so by the journal staff.

Registered Report Protocol - A Registered Report Protocol is an article that reports a study's rationale, proposed methodology for data collection and analysis; it may also include pilot data that motivate the research proposal. Registered Report Protocols undergo peer-review prior to conducting experiments, data collection or analysis to ensure that the planned research will meet the *PLOS ONE* publication criteria. If that is the case, the Registered Report Protocol is published and authors are given an in-principle acceptance in *PLOS ONE* for the Registered Report article which will report their methods and findings upon completion of the research.

The Registered Report will publish as a Research article and will be linked to its published Registered Report Protocol.

Lab Protocol - Lab Protocols are articles comprising detailed step-by-step descriptions of experimental and computational techniques, which allow readers to implement these techniques in their own research. The articles provide more in-depth experimental and analytical details and guidance than would typically be included in a research article. As part of a partnership between PLOS and [protocols.io](#), published lab protocols are hosted jointly on the [protocols.io](#) and *PLOS ONE* platforms.

Study Protocol - A Study Protocol is a plan for conducting research, which includes the background, rationale, objectives, methodology, statistical plan, and organization of a research project. *PLOS ONE* accepts submissions of Study Protocols for [any study type which would be accepted](#) as a research article. Study Protocols must have received approval from an ethics committee before submission, if applicable.
